IDs to Vote

Bring one of these to vote:

- 1. Voter registration document(s)
- Virginia driver's license (expired okay for voting)
- 3. U.S. passport (not expired more than 12 months)
- 4. Identification card issued by a government agency of the Commonwealth, one of its political subdivisions, or the United States
 - Student identification card (not expired more than 12 months) issued by any institution of higher education located in any state or territory of the United States
 - Student identification card (not expired more than 12 months) issued by any public or private high school located in Virginia
 - Employee identification card (not expired more than 12 months) containing a photograph of the voter in the ordinary course of the employer's business
 - Copy of a current utility bill, bank statement, government check, paycheck, or other government document containing the name and address of the voter.
 - If you do not have an acceptable ID when you come to vote, you can vote a regular ballot by signing an ID statement affirming your identity.

Early Voting 2020 in Lancaster County

Based on the data in the VAN (Voter Activation Network) as of September 28th, sevenhundred and eighty-five voters already have cast their ballots in Lancaster County. Historically, Lancaster County is 42% Democrat. However based on voter characteristics, 56% of early voters are likely Democrats!

In other words 16% of strong Democrats already have voted compared to 9% of strong Republicans; a significant enthusiasm advantage! Let's keep the votes coming in.

How to Vote Early in Lancaster County

Early voting for everyone has begun at the Voter Registration Office at the Lancaster Courthouse. All excuses previously required for a voter to be eligible to vote in-person or by mail using an absentee ballot are eliminated. No-excuse, early voting is available during regular business hours 8:30 am to 4:30 pm, Monday through Friday, at the Voter Registration Office at the rear of the County Administration Building (follow the signs). In addition, on the two Saturdays before Election Day, you may vote at the Voter Registration Office.
